Welcome home! This course is for the serious artist to develop a strong personal portfolio. Students planning to pursue a career in the visual and creative arts should work to complete the specific portfolio requirements of their university of choice.

<u>What will I learn?</u>

You will continue to learn about the artists and artworks that inspired the styles and movements that have informed the contemporary artists working today. You will create a final digital portfolio that may include:

- Observation Drawings (from life)
- Mixed Media Works
- Drawings
- Paintings
- Black & White AND Color Pieces
- Choice-Based Themes and Subjects
- Advanced Presentation

What will I learn?

You will need to bring your <u>charged</u> laptop, a sketchbook, a pencil, & portfolio checklist to every class. You <u>may</u> use your phone to find references instead of your laptop as long as you have access to Microsoft Teams and your student email. You are also encouraged to bring an apron or old *t*-shirt with you to class to protect your clothing.

What will I need to bring?

This year is ALL about YOU! You will set your own goals and choose your subject matter and style. Projects will make up the entirety of your grade in this class. Each project is worth 100 points and will be graded using a rubric that will be given to you at the beginning of each project. It is important that you follow the portfolio checklist you received at the beginning of the year. All requirements must be completed by the end of the school year or they will be entered as zeros. At least 2 projects must be completed in any marking period (12 by the end of the year). Incomplete work will not earn a passing grade. No work may be submitted after the last day of any quarter; No exceptions.

How will I be graded?

You are responsible for your materials and for the maintenance of your personal and shared workspaces, At the beginning of the year, you will be assigned a drawer for the storage of your work and materials. Drawers must be cleaned out at the end of each project. Missing and/or damaged materials may need to be replaced by the student.

What is expected of me?

You are also responsible for keeping track of due dates and your grades as you complete projects and assignments. If you have questions or want to talk about the grades entered in PowerSchool, please send me a message in Teams and we will schedule a time to talk privately.
