

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There is no text for this course. Your lessons are being designed based on the Next Generation Learning Standards posted on nysed.gov, the Common Core modules posted on engageNY.com and the website emathinstruction.com created by Kirk Wieler.

I will also be using any other resource I can find online and in textbooks that I have available to me. We will be concentrating on the skills needed to be successful on the Next Generation Learning Standards (NGLS) Geometry Regents Exam.

ALL Geometry students will be taking the NGLS Geometry Regents Exam on June 11, 2024. The exam is earlier than usual because this will be the first exam that focuses on the “Next Generation Learning Standards” as opposed to the “Common Core Learning Standards.” The time is needed to set the grading scale.

GRADING POLICY

Tests: 40% Quizzes: 20% 10 week test: 20% Homework: 10% Participation: 10%

CLASSROOM POLICIES

1. There will be a homework assignment for every day of class. The weekly packet of assignments will be posted in the Geometry microsoft TEAM as needed and handed out in packet form the first day of the week. Completion of homework is the best way to achieve understanding of new topics and retain skills already learned. If a student is struggling with problems on the homework assignment, please contact Mrs. Haynes for extra help as soon as possible.
2. It is normally preferred to alternate quizzes and tests on the last day of each week. This means for each quarter, it is possible to have four quizzes and four tests. Although, this is not always the case. There will be a '10 week test' each quarter also. Think of the '10 week test' as a mini final exam of the topics discussed during the quarter.
3. There will be a notebook quiz given at the end of each marking period.
4. The participation portion of the class average is based upon the following: class preparation and participation, tardies, unexcused absences, behavior, etc.

Each student begins each marking period with a grade of 100 for participation.
Any infraction of the above listed criteria loses 3 points per incident from the participation grade.

5. Homework will be given every class. **ALL** necessary work must be shown in **PENCIL**. Feel free to use extra loose leaf paper if there isn't enough room on the homework assignment from the packet.

Homework is collected and graded in the following manner:

Every class day, a die will be rolled at the beginning of class.

The homework will be graded in the following manner:

ODD NUMBER ROLL (graded out of 3 points)
This is considered an "effort" grade

- 0 - nothing turned in or just a page of answers (or partially complete in PEN)
- 1 - assignment has been attempted
- 2 - assignment is almost complete or the assignment is completely done in pen or work has not been shown
- 3 - assignment is completed in pencil, neatly, and all work has been shown

EVEN NUMBER ROLL (graded out of 10 points)

0 - nothing turned in or just a page of answers or homework has been done in pen

1pt is deducted for every two questions that are incorrect. Please understand that if no work has been shown, the question will be considered incorrect.

If a question has been skipped, it is an automatic 1 pt deduction.

6. Students must take notes during class and review the notes *every night* and while working on homework.
7. Late homework will *not* be accepted.
8. If a student is absent from school, he/she is still responsible to complete any homework assignment given.
9. If a student is absent from school, he/she must contact the teacher on the day he/she returns to school to make arrangements to make up any missed tests or quizzes.

SPECIAL NOTE Field trips, music lessons, and other missed classes where a student is still considered **IN SCHOOL** do not count as absences. A student is responsible for any material covered just as if he/she had been present in class.

This means any assignment is due **BEFORE** the missed class.

10. Any test or quiz grade of 85 points or higher earns a coupon (student choice).
Coupons can be used for things like: replacing lowest homework grade with perfect score, bonus points for future test or quiz, pencil, pens, etc.

11. Daily required materials: pencil, pen, eraser, 3- ring binder and calculator.

(TI-nspire graphing calculators are issued to each student just like a textbook. Please see the accompanying letter)
